Page 1-93 Subarticle 109-8, add the following:

The base index price for DIESEL #2 FUEL is \$1.8403 per gallon.

Where any of the following are included as pay items in the contract, they will be eligible for fuel price adjustment.

Division 2 Earthwork

Page 2-16, Subarticle 230-1(D), add the words: The Contractor specifically waives as the first words of the sentence.

Page 2-17, Article 230-4(B) Contractor Furnished Sources, first paragraph, first sentence replace with the following:

Prior to the approval of any borrow sources developed for use on any project, obtain certification from the State Historic Preservation Officer of the State Department of Cultural Resources certifying that the removal of the borrow material from the borrow sources(s) will have no effect on any known district, site building, structure, or object, architectural and/or archaeological that is included or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places.

Division 8 Incidentals

Page 8-9, Article 802-2 General Requirements, add the following as the 1st paragraph:

Prior to the removal of any waste from any project, obtain certification from the State Historic Preservation Officer of the State Department of Cultural Resources certifying that the deposition of the waste material to the proposed waste area will have no effect on any known district, site building, structure, or object, architectural and/or archaeological that is included or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Furnish a copy of this certification to the Engineer prior to performing any work in the proposed waste site.

REVISED PROJECT SPECIAL PROVISIONS Utilities

UTILITY CONFLICTS:

General:

The following utility companies have facilities that will be in conflict with the construction of this project:

- A. Deltacom
- B. Piedmont Natural Gas
- C. Fayetteville Public Works Commission (Water & Sewer)
- D. Fayetteville Public Works Commission (Power)
- E. Embarq
- F. Time Warner
- G. Level 3

The conflicting facilities of these concerns will be adjusted prior to the date of availability, unless otherwise noted and are therefore listed in these special provisions for the benefit of the Contractor. All utility work listed herein will be done by the utility owners. All utilities are shown on the plans from the best available information.

The Contractor's attention is directed to Article 105-8 of the Standard Specifications.

Utilities requiring Adjustment:

A. Deltacom

- 1. See "Utilities by Others Plans" for utility conflicts.
- 2. New facilities will be installed and conflicting facilities abandoned by March 15, 2009.

B. Piedmont Natural Gas

1. See "Utilities by Others Plans" for utility conflicts.

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- 2. All facilities in conflict will be lowered by Date of Availability except between structures 8, 9 and 10. The 4" steel gas main will be adjusted during construction.
- 3. Service Connections will be adjusted during construction.

C. Fayetteville Public Works Commission (Water & Sewer)

- 1. See "Utilities by Others Plans" for existing utility locations.
- 2. All facilities will be adjusted/lowered by March 15, 2009.
- 3. Service laterals will be adjusted during construction.

D. Fayetteville Public Works Commission (Electrical)

- 1. See "Utilities by Others Plans" for new underground power locations.
- 2. New underground longitudinal power ducts will be installed by March 15, 2009.
- 3. The proposed underground power crossings at Donaldson Street and east of Robeson Street will be coordinated with the Roadway Contractor during construction. The Roadway Contractor will be required to give one (1) week notification to PWC and then allow two (2) weeks construction time for each new crossing to be installed as shown on the UBO plans.

E. Embarq

- 1. See "Utility by Others Plans" for existing utility locations.
- 2. All conflicting utilities will be adjusted during roadway construction.
- 3. Contractor will provide 72 hour notice to Embarq once the Contractor gets close to the following cross-line structures (but not limited to these areas) to allow Embarq to have a crew on site to support or lower the conduit due to drainage installation. Embarq's crew will require 24 hours to adjust the existing terra cotta conduit at structures 3, 9, 17, 21 and 31A if required due to new drainage installation.
- 4. Embarq's aerial cables will be placed inside the new underground conduit that is to be installed by PWC (Electrical).
- 5. After the Contractor has removed the existing pavement in the eastbound lanes, Embarq will install new conduits from the existing manhole located at Survey Station 13+40 to Survey Station 39+60. These conduits will be installed by open cut above the existing conduits that are to remain in place. Embarq will be installing the conduit while the roadway contractor installs the drainage pipes. Embarq's work will not interfere or delay the roadway contractor's work on this project. Embarq will bore all railroad crossings and will be responsible for securing the required permits from the railroads.

F. Time Warner

- 1. Time Warner will place its aerial cable inside the new underground conduit that is to be installed by PWC (Electrical).
- 2. All work is to be completed by March 15, 2009.

G. Level 3

- 1. Level 3 will place its aerial cable inside the new underground conduit that is to be installed by PWC (Electrical).
- 2. All work is to be completed by March 15, 2009.
